EDD Japan Student Research Application Deadline Approaching

The October 23rd deadline is rapidly approaching for qualified New Mexico students to apply for an opportunity to do laboratory research in Japan through a program facilitated by the New Mexico Economic Development Department (EDD).

The program is aimed at promoting scientific research cooperation between Japan and the United States. 15 masters, doctoral and post-doctoral students will be selected from New Mexico's research universities and laboratories to do 12 months of research in Japan, starting in Winter 2010.

The areas of research have been selected by scientific and technology research project managers in Japan. They include: renewable energy, environmental energy, environmentally-related nanotechnology and nanophotonics. The projects are designed by the laboratory manager in Japan and will be discussed with qualified program applicants at a later date.
