This course is accredited by the International Economic Development Council (IEDC). IEDC, the nation's largest membership organization for economic developers, provides conferences, clearinghouse services, research and professional development opportunities.

About the Course

The New Mexico Economic Development Basic Course will introduce you to the strategies, concepts of economic development. This newly updated format will give you the opportunity to enhance your skills in a hands on environment. Each participant will gain a basic knowledge of the scope and research required to grow the economy in your region. This course offers you practical knowledge for enhancing the economy, you will leave with a template and a process for doing an economic road map for your community.

College Credit

Three hours of undergraduate or graduate credit are available to course participants. All students taking the course for college credit are required to attend the 4-hour class on Sunday afternoon, in addition to the rest of the course. A written exam is required, and for graduate students, an instructor-approved project is due on later than November 3, 2018.

Check-In

Students must check in between 11 AM & 5 PM on Sunday, July 22nd in the lobby of the Student Memorial Building (SMB) by Miller Library (on the campus of WNMU). You will receive conference materials at check-in.

Dress

Casual dress is encouraged. Shorts, tennis shoes and sandals are fine. The weather in July ranges from a high in the mid-80s to evening temperatures in the low 70s.

Housing

If you plan to stay on campus, the cost is \$35 per person/per night, plus a one-time fee of \$30 for bedding, for a shared residence hall suite. Suites include five private bedrooms, two bathrooms, and a shared living space.
